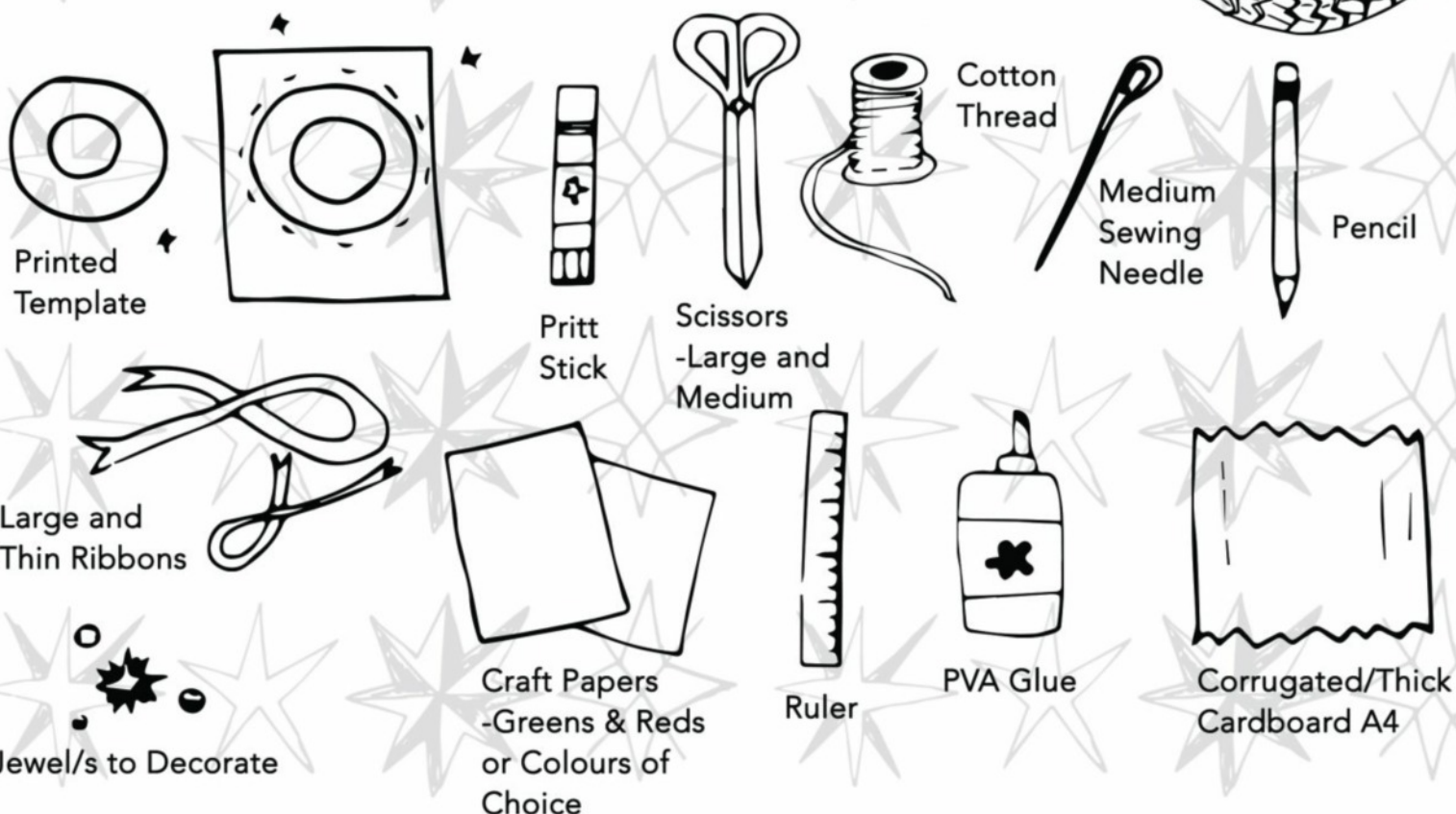




# D.I.Y Christmas Crafts: Small Paper Wreath



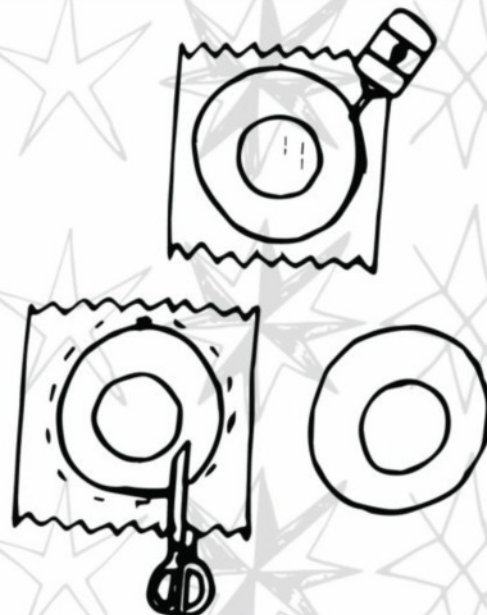
## You Will Need:

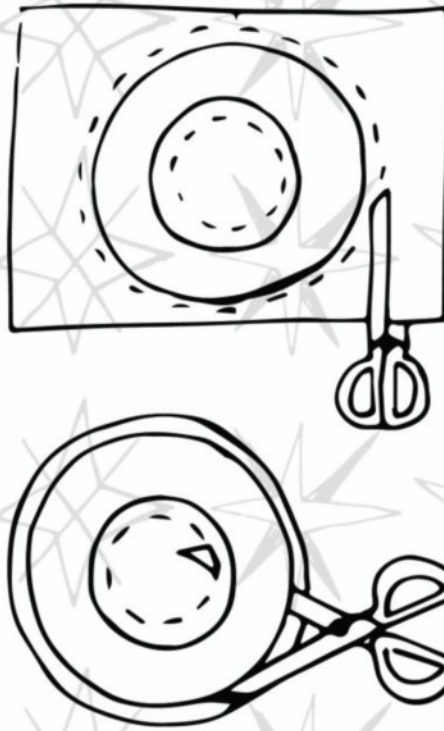
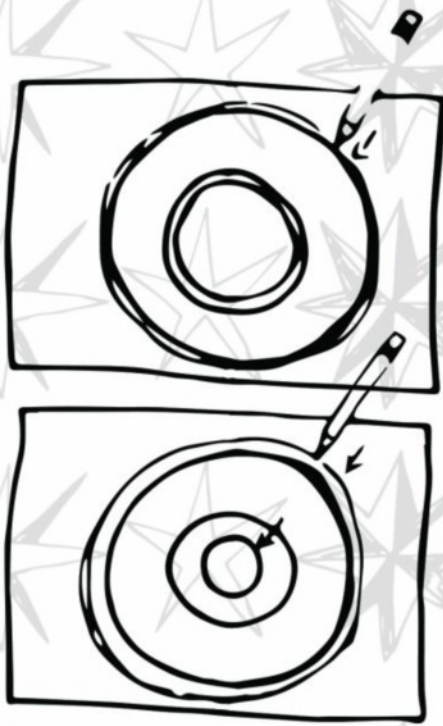


## Step 1: Cut out Wreath Base

Cut out the printed wreath template and pritt stick this onto the cardboard.

Using the larger scissors cut out the wreath shape, cutting the outside then the centre.



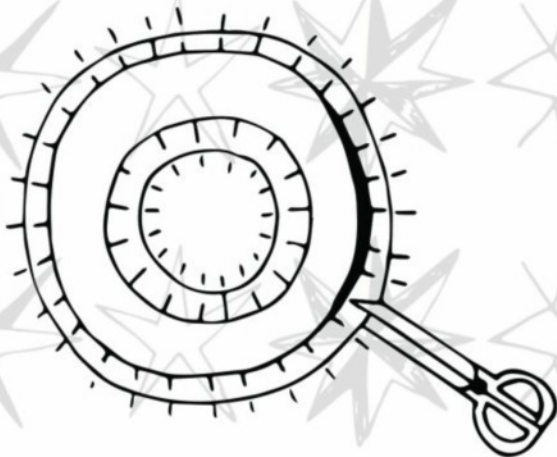


## Step 2: Add Colour

Stick your cardboard wreath onto a green sheet of A4 paper using the pritt stick.

Draw around it using a pencil, but make sure to leave about an inch on the outer circle and the inner circle.

Cut this out using scissors and lines drawn as your guide.



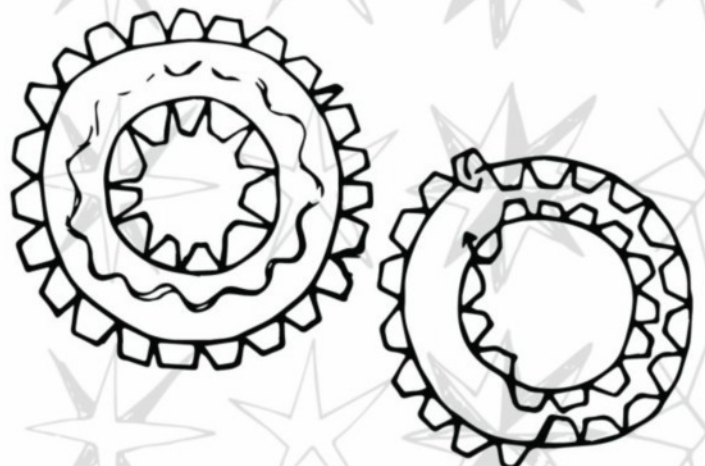
## Step 3: Shape

Trim the edges all the way around the wreath (inner and outer circle) using the medium sized scissors. Make sure not to cut the cardboard only the paper.

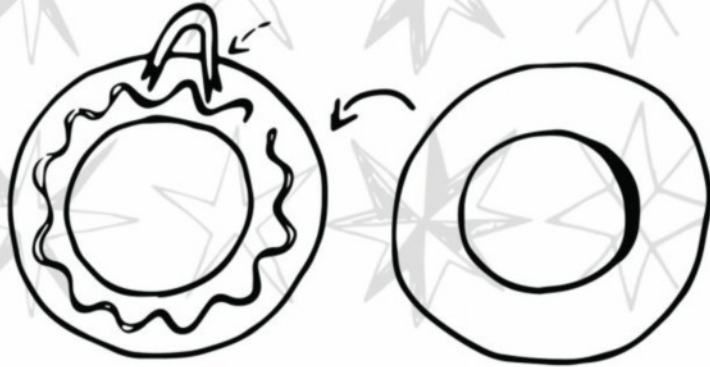
## Step 4: Stick

PVA glue around the edge of the inner and outer cardboard circle.

Fold down and stick each of the tabs.







### Step 5: Seal

Cut out another printed template and stick this to a sheet of A4 Paper to match using pritt stick.

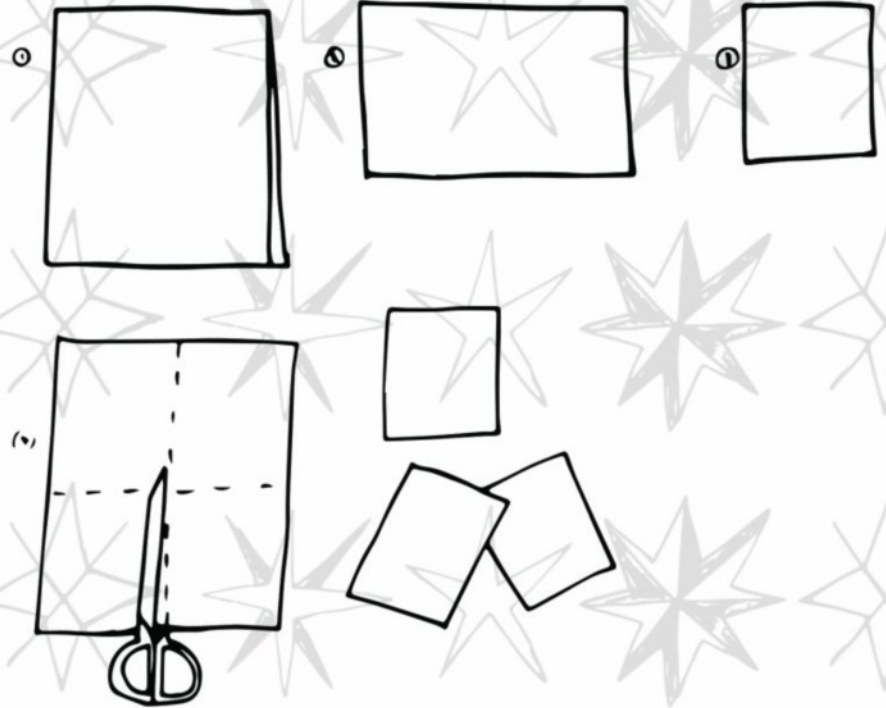
Cut this out using the template as your guide, cut the outer circle then the inner circle.

Cut a small piece of thin ribbon and PVA glue this to the back. Pritt stick the exposed back of the wreath and stick on your cut out template, coloured side showing.

### Step 6: Cut Wreath Foliage

Fold an A4 sheet of paper in half horizontally, then fold in half again vertically.

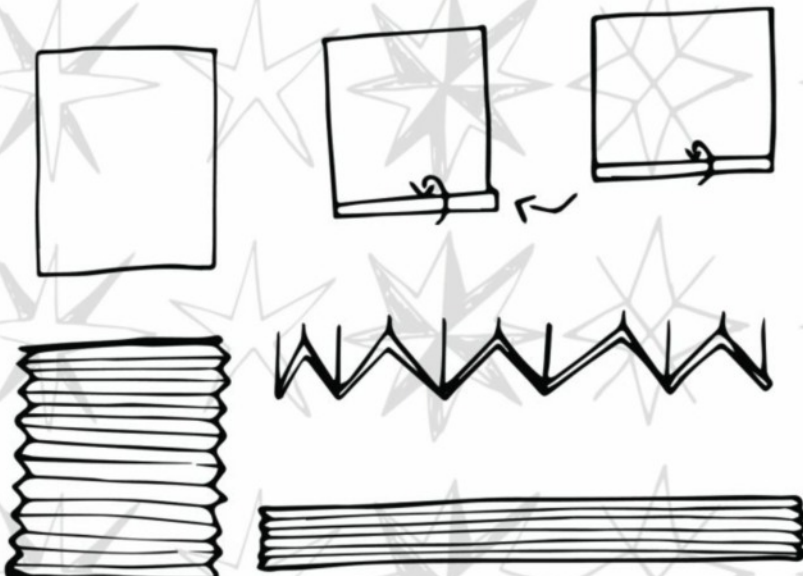
Cut down these creases so you have four A6 sheets of paper.



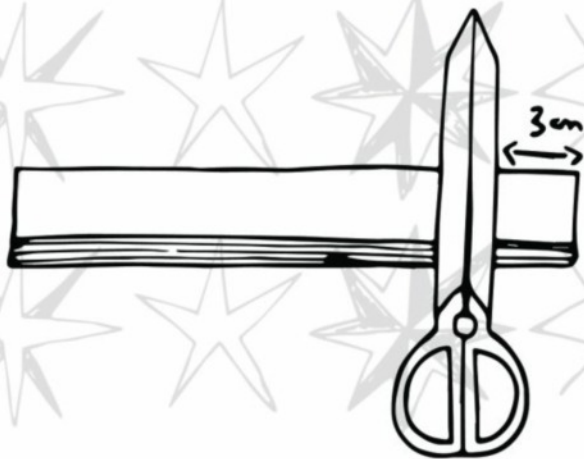
### Step 7: Fold Wreath Foliage

Create a zigzag fold by horizontally folding a thin strip at the edge of your A6 paper. Flip this over and repeat this process over and over until you reach the opposite end of the paper (see image).

Continue to make these zigzag folded strips using the A6 paper until you have your desired amount to make the wreath.







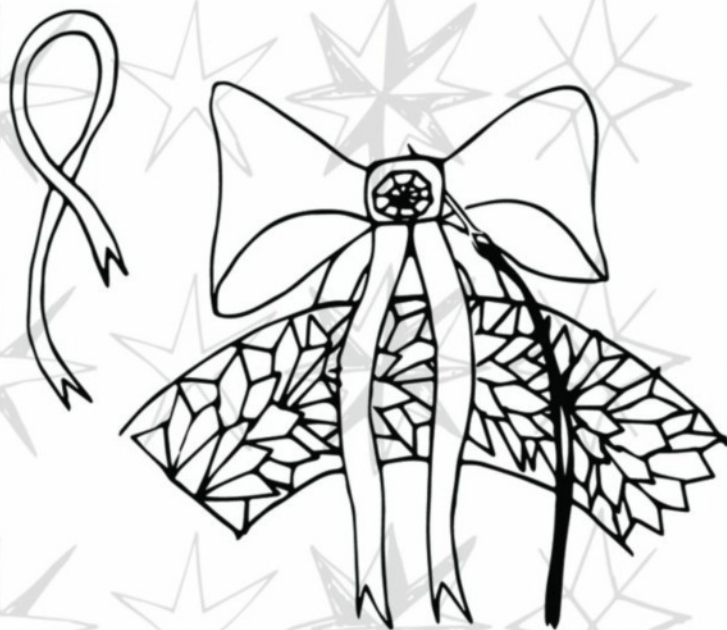
## Step 8: Cut Wreath Foliage

From the zigzag folded strips, snip off 3cm width sections. Snip and gather enough of these until you have enough to fill your wreath.

## Step 9: Stick Wreath Foliage

Attach each of the foliage individually by pritt sticking one end of the 3cm strip to the inner part of the wreath. Fan this out and stick the other end to follow on the outer part of the wreath (see image).

Repeat this process, sticking them close to one another until your wreath is full all the way around. You could also alternate the colours so that you have an eye catching pattern!

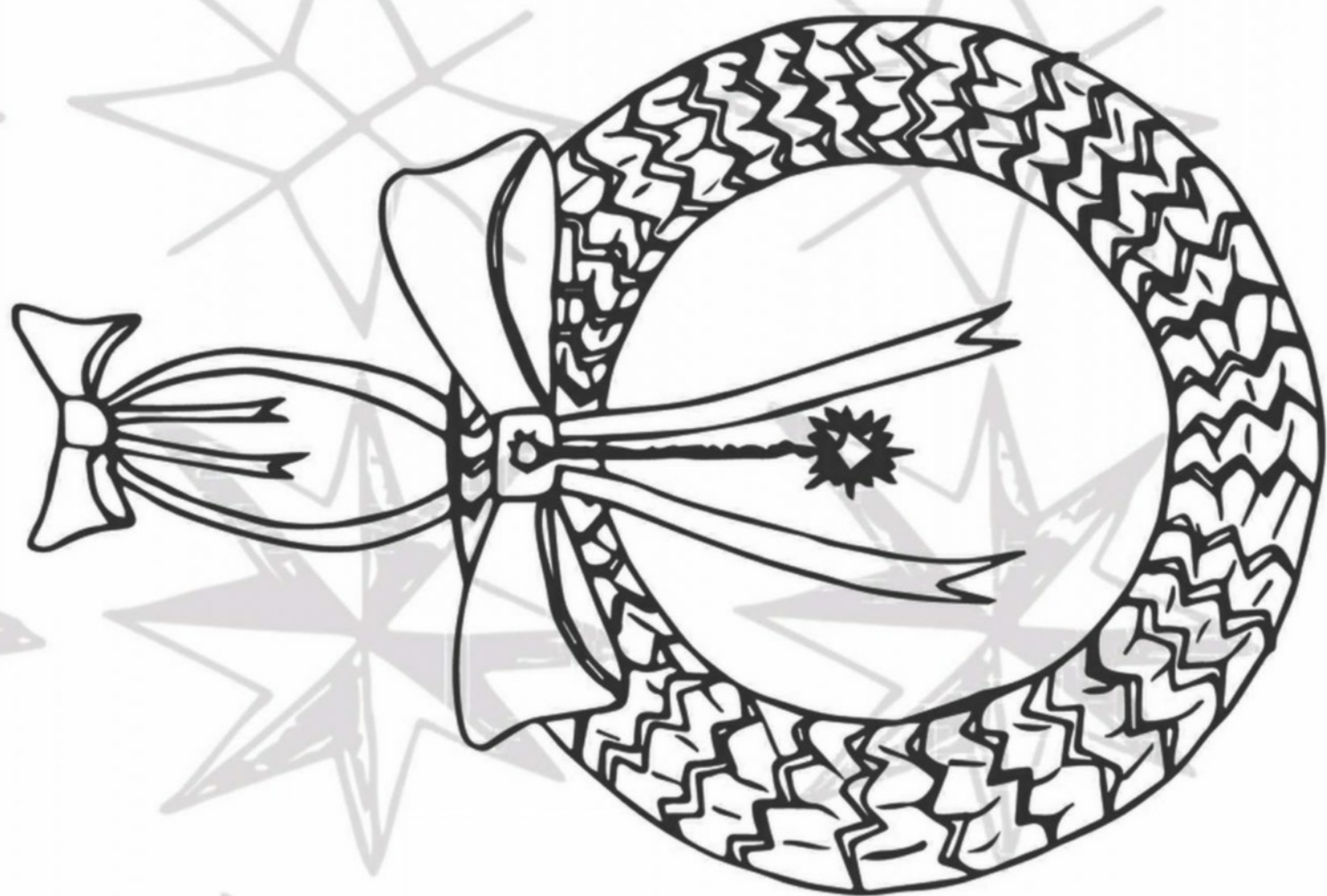


## Step 10: Finishing Touches

Make a bow out of your large ribbon then sew this using the needle and thread onto the top of the thinner ribboned hoop. You can also add a jewel to the centre of your ribbon for decoration.

**Congratulations! you have completed your wreath! hang it proudly on your door. However, it would have to be inside as its make of paper..**
